



Domiciliary care managers on the Register

1 April 2019



What are the main points?

Domiciliary care managers have had to register with us since **2014**

773 managers are registered, an increase from **642** last year

745 are currently working in domiciliary care

The Register is now open to domiciliary care workers, who must be registered by April **2020**



What are the five-year trends?

The number of domiciliary care managers on the Register has grown steadily year-on-year

The ratio of women to men has remained unchanged at **4:1**

The percentage of managers working in the third sector has increased from **19% in 2014** to **31% this year**

The percentage working for local authority social services has fallen from **20% in 2014** to **11% this year**



How many left and joined the Register?

In the last year, **85** managers left the Register and **216** joined

53% of those leaving did not maintain their registration

18% changed to a job that didn't require registration

6% retired

5% changed to an adult care home manager



What qualifications do managers hold?

All domiciliary care managers hold a relevant qualification

41% now hold the current QCF Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care Services (Adults' Management)

All others hold an accepted equivalent qualification



Where are managers employed?

56% work in the private sector

31% work in the third sector

11% work in local authority social services

30% of managers have been in their current role for more than **10** years

52% of managers have changed to a new role within the last five years



What is the profile of managers?

There are **624** women and **149** men

The average age of managers is **49**

98% of managers are white, white British, white Welsh or white Irish

37% of managers speak some Welsh or are fluent

2% of managers have a disability
